VILLAGE RECEIVES \$1.7 MILLION GRANT TO REPLACE CLEARMONT PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE

The Village of Elk Grove has been awarded a \$1,667,205 grant through the Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) for the replacement of the Clearmont Pedestrian Bridge over Salt Creek.

The Village’s Clearmont Pedestrian Bridge project is one of 99 projects in Illinois to receive such funding as part of the Rebuild Illinois program, which encourages safe travel across various modes of transportation at the local government level. State Representative Marty Moylan, State Representative Seth Lewis, State Senator Laura Murphy, and State Senator Thomas Cullerton were instrumental in helping the Village securing the \$1.7 million in funding which has made this project possible.

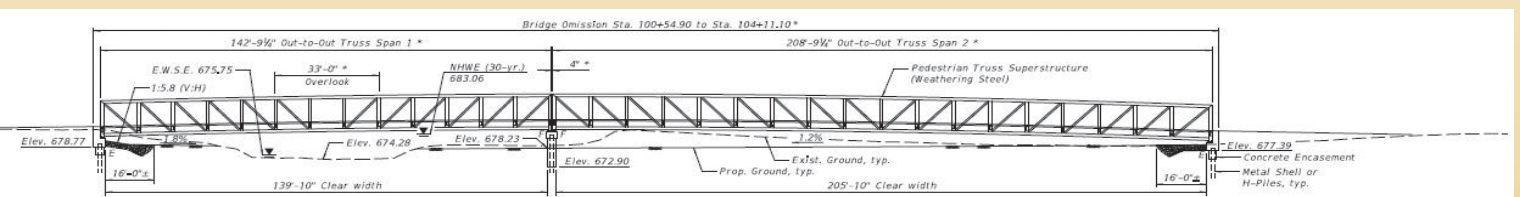
This project will include the replacement of the existing 8-foot wide structure with a new 14-foot wide bridge to allow easier access for both pedestrian and bicycle users.

The new long-span structure will be nearly twice the length of the existing bridge, and will touch down outside the existing floodplain limits. This provides for safer and uninterrupted pedestrian and bicycle access usage, even when Salt Creek floods. Currently, when water levels in Salt Creek are high, the water overtops the existing bridge, making the bridge and surrounding area unusable until the water recedes.

The new steel truss bridge will also include replacement of pathway lighting, aesthetic improvements, and installation of an overlook for pedestrians to view wildlife. The project is currently in the design phase, with construction scheduled for 2022.

The Clearmont pedestrian bridge serves the Village and surrounding communities by providing a necessary crossing over Salt Creek to connect to Salt Creek Trail, Busse Woods Forest Preserve, and Rainbow Falls Waterpark. Locally, the pedestrian bridge provides connectivity to Clearmont Elementary, Salt Creek Elementary, Grove Junior High, Elk Grove High School, and several parks and recreational fields.

The ITEP grant will provide funding for 80% of construction costs for the project, which total \$2.1 million. The Village is responsible the remaining 20% of construction costs, as well as the costs expended for preliminary and design engineering. The total project cost is estimated at \$2,404,110.

VILLAGE BIKE PLAN—ROUTE UPDATE

The Village is proposing a Route Update to the Village’s Bike Plan and we want your input! Since adopting our Bike Plan in 2015, the Village has completed several infrastructure projects with the help of grant funding, including new access points for Busse Woods and a new multi-use path along Biesterfeld Road to provide safer crossing at Meacham Road. In order to continue to qualify for future grant funding to support improvements to the Village’s bicycle network, the routes shown in the Village’s Bike Plan must be kept up to date.

The Elk Grove Village Bike Plan Task Force met late last year to discuss updates to existing and proposed routes included in the 2015 Village Bike Plan. The proposed Route Update better reflects existing, planned, and future projects in our community. These proposed changes will help the Village qualify for future grant funding which helps support continued improvements to the Village bicycle network.

Residents can provide comments on the proposed Route Update both online and in person. The Village has created an interactive online map which allows users to comment directly on areas of interest or concern. The map’s commenting options enable residents to show support for proposed bike routes, identify gaps in planned routes, and comment on routes. Residents can provide comments on the map until August 20 at www.elkgrove.org/bike.

Residents are also invited to attend an open house on August 11 to learn more about the proposed Route Update and provide feedback.

BE AWARE OF TEXT MESSAGE/EMAIL SCAMS

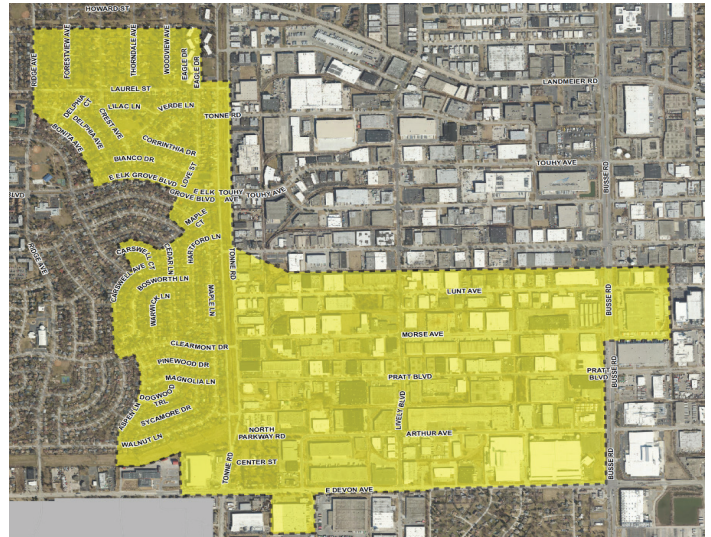
The Elk Grove Village Police Department would like to warn everyone to be on alert for unsolicited text messages and/or emails with containing fraudulent links claiming to be from official government organizations, such as the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) and the Illinois Secretary of State’s office (SOS). IDOT and SOS will never request personal information, such as Social Security Numbers or banking details, via text or email.

If you receive an unexpected text message or email from IDOT or SOS, do not click on any links provided, delete the message/email, block the sender, and report the sender to www.reportfraud.ftc.gov.



SMOKE TESTING SCHEDULED TO BEGIN ON JULY 26 FOR THE EAST CENTRAL SECTION OF THE VILLAGE

From July 26 through August 6, the Village’s contractors, Duke’s Root Control and Engineering Enterprises Inc., will be conducting smoke testing of the Village’s sanitary sewer system in the area of Devon Ave. to Howard St. and Busse Rd. to Ridge Ave. The dates of the smoke testing are tentative because testing is dependent on weather conditions and project impacts. The testing is required by the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) for the area of the Village with the highest amount of rain water entering the Village’s sanitary sewer system. This area includes a mix of residential and business properties, which are highlighted on the map in yellow.



Testing will occur between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., during which time crews will blow a harmless, non-toxic smoke into the sanitary sewer system to detect faulty pipes that allow rainfall or groundwater to enter the

Village’s sanitary sewer system. Crews will move throughout the area on a section by section basis documenting smoke coming from vent stacks, manholes, and holes in the ground. The public should not be alarmed as the smoke is harmless, non-toxic, non-staining, has no odor, does not create a fire hazard, and will dissipate in a few minutes. This process identifies where there are defects in the sanitary sewer system, and this information will make the sanitary sewer system more effective, efficient, and reduce pollution.

POOL SAFETY

As the summer season continues, the Community Development Department would like to remind you of some important pool safety tips:

- Assign an adult who won't be distracted by talking with friends or cooking on a grill to watch the pool when children are present.
- Keep a phone within easy reach of the pool area for emergency calls.
- At least one adult supervising should have CPR training.
- Clean water is essential for safe pool use.
- Only electrical devices that have been installed and inspected by qualified professionals should be in the pool.

2021 CITIZENS FIRE ACADEMY

The Fire Department will be hosting its Citizen's Fire Academy for Village residents and employees of Elk Grove businesses interested in learning more about the Fire Department and its operations. This six-week program will take place on Wednesday evenings from 6pm to 9pm at Fire Station #8 located at 700 Fargo Ave. Topics covered include: Calling 911, Special Teams Operations, Fire Extinguisher Training, Auto Extrication, Hose Evolutions, Emergency Medical Services/CPR, and Disaster Preparedness.

Participants will tour the training tower, learn basic first aid skills, and use specialized tools and equipment to better understand the types of conditions encountered by firefighters. All students will also be fitted with a set of protective clothing to use during the course of the academy. The first session will be held on September 1 and the program will culminate with an evening of hands-on simulations on October 6.

VILLAGE MAINTAINS AA+ BOND RATING!

The Village was recently affirmed with a bond rating of AA+ indicating a very strong capacity to meet its long-term financial commitments. The Village receives periodic credit ratings as a means to invest back into the community, fund water-sewer infrastructure, street projects, and other large capital items.

Highlights from the report, published by Standard & Poor (S&P) Global Ratings, include the Village's healthy general fund reserve level, improved market values due to large-scale developments in the Business Park, and effective financial management policies and practices. The outlook for the Village moving forward is stable.

The report demonstrates the Village has experienced a strong economy, high budgetary performance and steady management policies, while also being impacted by long-term debt and significant pension liabilities.

- Conley serves as Chairman of the Board of Directors & Chair of High Performance, in addition to Interim President of USA Track & Field. It's not the only organization he supports. Mike shared his insight on how he transformed his passion into action.
- Conley has managed to balance work time and family time, and passed down some of his success to those around him.

From July 26 through August 6, the Village through our contractors Duke's Root Control and Engineering Enterprises Inc. will be conducting smoke testing of the Village's sanitary sewer system in the general area of Devon Ave. to Howard St. and Busse Rd. to Ridge Ave. The dates of the smoke testing are tentative because testing is dependent on weather conditions and project impacts. The testing is required by the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) for the area of the Village with the highest amount of rain water entering the Village's sanitary sewer system. This area includes a mix of residential and business properties, which are highlighted on the map on page 5.
