VILLAGE HOSTS FIRST EVER JOB FAIR



On July 30, the Village hosted its first ever job fair at Elk Grove High School. The event was open to the public and job seekers from all over the Chicagoland area. Over 500 job seekers were able to connect with over 130 potential employers, including Elk Grove businesses from high tech, food service, entertainment, manufacturing and government sectors.

Job seekers had the opportunity to meet employers and attend breakout sessions from workforce development experts on perfecting your elevator speech and interviewing tips. These seminars also provided job seekers with useful tips on maximizing their job search experience and strategies for approaching prospective employers at the job fair.

The Village hosted the job fair in an effort to support Elk Grove Village businesses and jobseekers in a post COVID-19 economy. In Elk Grove Village we put people first and we support our companies because we understand that they help take care of our community.

NEW RESIDENTIAL WASTE HAULER BEGINNING NOVEMBER 1. CHOOSE YOUR CART SIZE NOW!

Beginning November 1, 2021, Groot Industries will be the Village's new residential waste hauler. Following an extensive competitive proposal process, Groot was found to have an excellent reputation for service and to offer the most economical pricing. The new monthly fee for waste and recycling services will be \$21.10 for single-family detached homes and \$17 for townhomes. Single family/townhome service will include:

- Waste Cart (default 95 gal) and Recycling Cart (default 65 gal).
- Senior (65+) Discount for residents who pay their bills directly to Groot.
- Free curbside electronic recycling by appointment--2 items under 50lb per week.

Single family/townhome residents can choose between three sizes for their recycling and waste carts—35 gal, 65 gal, and 95 gal. To choose your cart size, call Groot at 847-734-6400 or email <u>elkgrove@groot.com</u> to provide your name, address, phone number, and the requested cart sizes. <u>Choices must be submitted by September 10, 2021</u>. If you do not submit a choice, you will be provided with the default cart sizes of 95 gallon for waste and 65 gallon for recycling.

VILLAGE COMPLETES MULTI-USE PATH & PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS ON BIESTERFIELD ROAD

On July 29, the Village held a ribbon-cutting ceremony to celebrate the completion of the multi-use path and pedestrian improvements along Biesterfield Road, from Michigan Lane to David Lane, which serve to further advance usability and safety for residents and visitors.

State Representative Michelle Mussman assisted the Village in securing a \$750,000 grant from the Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity (DCEO) for the bicycle and pedestrian improvements along Biesterfield Rd as part of the 2019 State Capital Bill.

"Pedestrian and bicycle safety is a top priority for communities in Illinois, and part of my work in Springfield is to ensure the State budget supports that priority," said State Representative Michelle Mussman. "These improvements will make it easier, and more importantly, safer for both local and regional residents traveling along Biesterfield Road."

The Village was also awarded \$250,250 from the Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways (CCDOTH) through the Invest in Cook grant program to support this project. Invest in Cook supports transportation improvements sponsored by local and regional governments which align with the Connecting Cook County Long Range Transportation Plan.

"I am a strong believer in making roadways more accessible for bicycles and pedestrians," said Cook County Commissioner Kevin Morrison. "Cook County's Long Range Transportation Plan is a tool that allows us to support these type of improvements in local communities."



These improvements to Biesterfield Road have filled an important gap in the bicycle route network. The new 8-foot multi-use path provides a connection for cyclists west of Meacham to the overpass at Interstate 290/Illinois Route 53, also known as the Community Bridge. Improvements also include expanded 6-foot sidewalks to provide additional capacity for the heavily traveled area near Adolph Link Elementary School.

Additionally, signalized intersections along this section of Biesterfield Road have been improved to include countdown signal heads, push buttons, ADA ramps and crosswalks for the safety of pedestrians, cyclists, and children going to and from school.

FALL LARGE BRANCH COLLECTION

The Village appreciates our residents' efforts to maintain their property and recognizes that disposing of tree debris from fall cleanup may be difficult. Therefore, the Public Works Department operates a Large Branch Collection Program to assist residents.

Important Large Branch Collection Program Rules:

• Large branches 3 ¹/₂ to 8 inches in diameter from all trees and bushes, except evergreens are eligible for pick-up (not bundled with twine).



• Residents MUST Contact Public Works at (847) 734-8800 Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. to get your address listed for pickup. Calls must be received no later than Friday 4:30 p.m. of the week prior to the scheduled pickup in your section of the community.

- Branches must be stacked in the parkway with cut ends pointing towards the curb.
- Branches should be placed in the parkway no sooner than the weekend before the designated pickup week.

The following items are NOT part of the collection program: logs, lumber, paneling, bushes, stumps, and evergreens as these items damage Village equipment. Please contact Waste Management at (800) 796-9696 for pickup guidelines regarding these items.

Large Branch Collection Pickup Weeks:

Residential Community East of IL Route 53: September 20 - September 24

Residential Community West of IL Route 53: September 27 - October 1

Homeowners are reminded that the Waste Management Yard Waste Program includes the removal of bagged yard waste as well as free small branch pickup April 1 through December 15. Branches must be bundled with biodegradable twine or string. Branches up to 3 ¹/₂ inches in diameter and no more than 4 feet in length or over 50 pounds in weight will be picked up by Waste Management FREE of charge. Please note that using yard waste bags require the purchase of a yard waste sticker.

This fall, the Elk Grove Village Public Works Department will be holding their first Citizen's Public Works Academy for residents interested in learning more about the Public Works Department and its operations. This five-week academy begins on October 21st and will take place on Thursday evenings from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at the James Paul Petri Public Works Facility located at 450 E. Devon Ave.

Participants will learn about public works operations, tour various facilities, and get to see the heavy duty vehicles and equipment that crews use on a daily basis. Topics covered include an Introduction to Public Works, Engineering, General Operations, Fleet and Building Services, and Water, Storm, and Sanitary Utilities.

The Village's Simple Recycling program offers a convenient and environmentally friendly way for Village residents to recycle old and used textile materials. To participate in this program, residents who receive curbside refuse and recycling services can fill up a simple recycling bag with unwanted and old textile items and place it at their curb on their regular collection day by 7 a.m. Simple Recycling trucks will collect the bags at the curb and will leave replacement bags in their place. ELK GROVE VILLAGE NAMED 2020 TREE CITY USA



Elk Grove Village has been named a 2020 Tree City USA community by the Arbor Day Foundation. The Tree City USA program recognizes excellence in urban forestry management and environmental improvement. A city only achieves this designation if they have a tree board or department, establishes a community tree ordinance, spends at least \$2 per capita on urban forestry, and celebrates Arbor Day.


The Village has continually gone above and beyond by not only meeting these criteria, but by offering tree evaluations, planting trees, and providing outstanding care. Since 2017, Elk Grove Village has planted approximately 2,650 trees throughout the community and over the next three years the village is planning on planting an additional 1,250 trees.

This is the 36th consecutive year that Elk Grove Village has received the Tree City USA designation. Over the years, the Village has continually demonstrated an exceptional commitment to maintaining a robust urban forest, which has contributed to environmental health as well as the aesthetic pride of the community.

DOOR TO DOOR SOLICITORS

All solicitors, except for a religious or political organization that is protected under the First Amendment, must apply for a solicitor permit in the Village Clerk's Office. A background investigation is conducted and a solicitor photo identification badge is provided to those that qualify. The Village does not support any company and does not endorse the character, method or product of the solicitor. Photos of all active solicitor permits can be found on the Village website at <u>elkgrove.org</u>.

Soliciting door-to-door is permitted in the Village of Elk Grove between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday. No soliciting is permitted on Sundays or on legal holidays.



Any suspicious individuals who cannot provide proof of solicitor identification from the Village should be reported immediately to the Police by calling 9-1-1.

Residents may display a "No Solicitors Invited" sign near the main entrance door if they are not interested in interacting with a solicitor. "No Solicitors Invited" decals are available in the Village Clerk's Office. For additional information, residents may contact the Village Clerk at 847-357-4040.
