# Overnight Parking Restrictions Waived for the Holidays

Overnight parking permission will begin on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>December 18 at 2:00</u> am and end on Monday, <u>January 3 at 5:00 am</u>.

Please note that residential street parking is prohibited if there is more than 2 inches of snow on the ground or if the Village is expecting snow. Vehicles must be cleared from the street until snow removal operations are finished.

# Elk Grove Honors Trustee Nancy J. Czarnik at Final Board Meeting

On Tuesday, November 16, long-time Village Trustee Nancy Czarnik was honored with a plaque on the Village's Rotunda of Recognition with sincere gratitude and appreciation of her dedicated service to the Village of Elk Grove. Mayor Craig B. Johnson and the Board of Trustees were joined by Trustee Czarnik's family and friends in recognition of her 32 years of devoted service and paid tribute to her accomplishments.

At the Village Board Meeting that evening, Trustee Czarnik was presented with a Czarnik Ct. street sign

on behalf of the Village and was recognized with a proclamation signifying her 32 years of public service on behalf of State Senator Laura Murphy. Trustee Czarnik received a standing ovation after giving her final remarks.

Nancy Czarnik was appointed in 1989, where she served the community for over 32 years. Nancy served with 3 Mayors, 11 Village Trustees, and 3 Village Managers. She attended 649 Village Board meetings; adopted 1,859 Village Ordinances and 1,989 Village Resolutions. The Village wishes Nancy the best in her future endeavors.





# Elk Grove Television Enables Live Closed Captioning on Video Programming

Last month, Elk Grove Television (EGTV) introduced a dynamic system supporting the display of closed captioning on all programming. Closed-captioning support for live

programming began last month and for on-demand programming will begin in January 2022. This is an important milestone in making the Village more accessible to all members of the community.

Live closed captioning systems display lines of text

on the screen that match the action in real-time, allowing the viewer to comprehend everything without sound. This system provides a written depiction of what is heard and said in a video or live stream.

When first installed, the accuracy of the closed-captioning

system begins at about 80%. As a machine learning system, this advanced technology will continue to improve over time and increase to 95% accuracy within just a few months.

The Village's proactive efforts to provide equal opportunity access to content comes at a time when public, educational, and government agencies are currently exempt from video captioning requirements.

In addition to ensuring access to individuals who are hard of hearing or deaf, live-closed captioning provides

many benefits including viewer flexibility, improved accessibility for viewers with English as a second language, and improved comprehension and retention. Closed captioning also allows for audiences to view content in environments where access to audio is limited.

#### Request Free Cart Size Exchange by December 31, 2021

#### **Groot Senior Discount Sign-up Information**

Senior residents aged 65 or older that reside in single-family or townhomes and pay their bill directly to Groot are eligible to receive a 10% senior discount. Here's how to sign up:

- Email a copy of your photo ID with age and home address to elkgrove@groot.com; OR
- Bring your ID to the Community Development Counter at Village Hall (901 Wellington Ave), Monday Friday, 8:00 am- 5:00 pm.



#### **Groot Service Reminders**

As Groot continues to provide waste and recycling services to residents, keep in mind the following reminders when it comes to additional services that are provided to residents:



Free Curbside Electronics Recycling: Groot offers free curbside electronic recycling by appointment. Residents can recycle up to two electronic waste items weighing less than 50 pounds each week. To schedule a pick-up, residents must contact Groot at 847-734-6400 at least 24 hours before their collection day. Please note that items that exceed 50 pounds will require a fee.

<u>Free Bulk Item Pick-up:</u> Residents may dispose of one bulk item (under 50 pounds) per week on their regular collection day at no additional cost. Bulk items are items too large to fit inside a waste cart that weighs 50 pounds or less and can be lifted by one driver without assistance. Examples of bulk items include barrels, crates, furniture, and mattresses.





Oversized/ Overweight Item Pick-up: For oversized or extra heavy items (exceeding 50 pounds), residents are required to schedule a special pick-up because they require two or more people to lift. A per-item fee will apply for each oversized item. To schedule a pick-up in advance, please contact Groot at 847-734-6400.

White Goods/ Appliances: Residents must call to schedule a special collection for white goods or appliance pick-up. Please call Groot in advance of your regular collection day at 847-734-6400 to schedule a pick-up at \$50.00 per item. After scheduling a pick-up, please note that white goods or appliances should not be placed at the curb until the evening before the scheduled collection. # **Holiday Light Recycling**

The Village is accepting unused and non-working holiday string lights and extension cords as part of the SWANCC Holiday Lights Recycling Program. SWANCC and participating communities have partnered with Elgin Recycling Inc. to recycle the lights and cords.

Residents can drop off holiday lights and extension cords now thru April 30, 2022. The Village cannot accept garland, live greens, wreaths, or other non-recyclable materials. Call 847-357-4220 for more information.



# Elk Grove Village's Snow and Ice Control

Winter is here and the Village is ready to provide safe and clear street. To help achieve our goal, please keep in mind the following:

#### **Priority Plowing and Salting**

During snow/icing events, Public Works crews focus on major streets first to provide access for emergency vehicles and heavier traffic, then begin working on all other streets.

Crews will continue this process for the duration of the storm and come back to clean up side streets after the snowfall has ended.

#### Your Role in Clearing Snow

Snow removal equipment is designed to push snow onto the right-of-way which may result in snow being pushed onto driveway aprons, mailboxes, sidewalks, and hydrants. Residents and businesses are encouraged to clear:



- Driveway aprons and mailboxes Place the snow onto your property or the adjacent parkway;
- **Sidewalks** Place the snow onto your property as the Village does not provide this service;
- Hydrants Clear the snow and ice three feet around all sides of hydrants to provide access in the case of an emergency.

Keep in mind that shoveling, blowing, or plowing snow into the street creates hazardous driving conditions, negates the effort of our snowplowing operations, and is prohibited by law. Please be careful when moving heavy snow.

#### Winter Weather Parking Restrictions

Parking on all Village streets is prohibited when 2 or more inches of snow has fallen or is predicted to fall. Parking is also prohibited on both sides of the street for 24 hours after the snowfall stops or until the clearing operation is complete.



#### Drive Safely and Remember to Yield

Remember to drive cautiously and yield to snow removal equipment and emergency vehicles.

# Winter Months are a Prime Time for Warm-up Thefts

Warm-up theft occurs when thieves steal cars that have been left running to warm up while unlocked and unattended -- it is an open invitation for thieves! If you must warm up your car unattended, use a remote starter or lock your vehicle and use a spare key. It only takes seconds for a thief to strike anywhere including residential areas, private driveways, convenience stores, and gas stations.

Never leave your car running while unlocked and unattended. Make sure to lock up your car and take your keys anytime, anywhere!

## Pace Dial-A-Ride

Pace provides curb-to-curb Dial-A-Ride bus service to Elk Grove Village residents Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Fares for a one-way trip are \$1.30 per person, with a discounted fare of \$0.65 for senior citizens (ages 65 or older) and disabled residents.

Residents are encouraged to call one hour in advance of their desired pickup time.

#### **Home Winterizing Tips**

Winter is on its way! It is important to protect the interior and exterior of your property from the cold weather. The following tips can help prepare your home for the winter season:

#### 1. Protect Pipes

Maintain a consistent temperature of at least 60°F in all areas of your home, and properly seal all possible entry points for outdoor air to prevent freezing of water pipes.

#### 2. Furnace Maintenance

Have an HVAC professional test and service your furnace annually to ensure all components are functioning properly.

#### 3. Fireplace Maintenance

Before using your fireplace for the first time this season, thoroughly clean it by removing soot and debris from the firebox and chimney. If your fireplace needs maintenance and/or repair, consult with a chimneysweeper or fireplace service technician.



#### Elk Grove Village's First Ever Public Works Citizen's Academy Graduates

Last month, 19 participants including Elk Grove's very own Police Chief Walsh and Former Trustee Nancy Czarnik graduated from Elk Grove Village's first ever Public Works Citizen's Academy. This 5-week program provided participants with an immersive experience into the Public Works Department's general operations, engineering, fleet and building services, and utility services.

Participants toured various Village facilities and had the opportunity to operate a backhoe, make their own street signs, take a ride in a snowplow and street sweeper, and more. When participants were asked to share their biggest take-away from the academy, they said:

## Simple Recycling

The Simple Recycling program offers a convenient and environmentally friendly way for residents in the Village to recycle old and unwanted textile materials.

Since the launch of the Simple Recycling program in September 2020, 103,633 pounds of textile materials have been collected! The Simple Recycling program is free to residents who receive curbside waste and recycling services in the Village.

To participate in the free program, residents can fill up orange simple recycling bags with old clothing or household items and place them at the curb on their normal refuse and recycling day. Once collected, items are sorted for quality and are either donated or broken down for raw materials.

## Is Your Car Ready For Winter Travel?



Don't wait until the first snowfall before thinking about how to be prepared while traveling.

- Check your wiper blades and headlights
- Ensure your car is filled with winter-appropriate windshield wiper fluid and keep a refill on hand.
- Keep a small shovel, ice scraper and snowbrush in your car at all times. You never know when a snowfall might hit.
- Stock your car with an emergency roadside kit consisting of a flashlight, warning devices (e.g., flares and reflective strips), a first aid kit, blankets, foods that are higher in sugar (e.g., chocolate bars and candy), jumper cables, and extra warm winter clothing.
