#### Annexation and Development at 720 Rohlwing Road

On July 18, 2023, the Village Board approved the annexation of a 100-acre property at 720 Rohlwing Road (commonly known as the WGN radio tower site). As part of the proposed development, the radio towers will be moved to the north end of the property where the conditions support their transmission needs. This will open up approximately 35 acres on the southern end of the property to be developed with three data center facilities and an ancillary electrical substation. Additionally, a small site along Rohlwing Road has been reserved for the construction of public pickleball courts to be operated by the Elk Grove Park District.

Prior to its annexation, 720 Rohlwing Road was in unincorporated Cook County. The developer had the option to pursue a development with Cook County, which would have been outside of the control of Village land use regulations. Since Nexstar preferred to have access to the Village's water and sewer infrastructure, they approached the Village about annexation.

The Village worked with the developer during the preliminary design phase to minimize the impact to adjacent residential homes. Additionally, Mayor Johnson hosted a meeting with neighboring residents last summer to explain the proposed development and hear their concerns. This early cooperation and communication with the developer and impacted residents allowed the Village to shape the proposed development to ensure it would be compatible with the neighboring residential properties.

Some of the requirements put into place for the annexation and development at 720 Rohlwing include:

- Use restrictions that only permit the operation of data centers and a supporting electric substation. Data centers are high-tech, low traffic facilities that have a minimal impact.
- Screening with a 9-foot tall berm, topped with an 8-foot decorative screen wall and dense landscaping to serve as a buffer for the adjacent neighborhood.

#### Elk Grove Village Designated Top Business Park For Second Consecutive Year

Business Facilities Magazine has designated Elk Grove Village as home to the nation's #1 business park for the second consecutive year! Business Facilities Magazine is the primary publication servicing the industrial and manufacturing site selection marketplace.

In designating Elk Grove's business park as the nation's leader, the magazine said that "Elk Grove Village Business Park has been recognized as leading park in U.S. due to sheer size, services, utilities, and logistics advantages."

Earlier this year, the Village announced that the amount of available business park space in Elk Grove Village had reached yet another all-time low, a reflection of a very healthy local economy and an indication that demand for industrial property in the suburb remains among the highest in the region. The Elk Grove Village Business Park is the nation's largest business park, with almost 65 million square feet of inventory, 5,600 businesses, and over 400 manufacturers.

- Increased setback requirements the buildings are setback a minimum of 178 feet from residential property lines and a 25' grassy area will be maintained in front of the berm to maintain visual space for residents.
- Minimizing construction impact by requiring the berm and screen wall be built within the first 12 months.
- Addressing stormwater drainage concerns by requiring the developer extend the existing Village storm sewer system along the south side of the property and provide for

connection to sump pumps in the rear yards of neighboring properties. Additionally, the Village is rehabilitating the existing storm sewer along the west side of the development.

These requirements were formalized as part of the petitions that were recommended for approval by the Plan Commission at the public hearing on June 5, 2023. Construction for this development is anticipated to begin in the fall of this year and will occur in phases over the next 8 years.

# "Makers Wanted" Showcased During Chicago NASCAR Race

The No. 6 Mustang, driven by Brad Keselowski, was wrapped in the Makers Wanted logo and included "Elk Grove Village, IL" across the hood and sides of the racecar. Throughout the nationally televised broadcast of the race, several commercials for the Makers Wanted campaign aired that featured Brad Keselowski promoting Elk Grove Village as a "Beyond Business Friendly" community. The NASCAR Chicago Street Race was the most watched NASCAR race on NBC in the last six years, with over 5 million viewers!

The Makers Wanted campaign and the sponsorship of a NASCAR racecar and driver is part of a greater recruitment effort to attract businesses to the Elk Grove Business Park. Maintaining a strong business community and attracting new businesses keeps the local economy strong.

### **Pace Dial-A-Ride Update - Riders Must Register**

Pace Dial-A-Ride will begin using a Rider ID system on September 5, 2023. Residents who use the Dial-A-Ride service must fill out the registration form included on the page to the left and return it to Village Hall by mail or in-person before September 5, 2023.

The Rider ID system allows Pace to keep a record of riders' basic information, emergency contact information, and special accommodations. If there are any issues with the ride, Pace will already have contact information ready to inform the rider(s).

Additionally, the Rider ID system makes it much easier for Pace and the Village to investigate and follow up on any issues reported by Dial-A-Ride customers.

While residents are required to register for a Rider ID, they do not need to remember their ID number. When calling for service, a resident would only need to provide their first and last name, along with the time and location of pick-up and drop-off.

Beginning September 5, 2023, any rider without a Rider ID will be required to register with Pace in advance of using the Dial-A-Ride service. Once the form is turned in to Village Hall, it will take approximately 4-5 business days for a registration to be processed and completed. Please fill out one registration form per rider.

# Volunteers Needed to Re-Open PADS Shelter for People in Need

Public Action to Deliver Shelter (PADS) is a community organization that provides food, overnight lodging, comfort, friendship, and respect to those who have fallen on hard times and need a helping hand. PADS has alternating weekday sites at various places of worship throughout the Northwest suburbs and is staffed by volunteers.

At Christus Victor Lutheran Church, every Tuesday night from October through April, volunteers from PADS give their time to coordinate housing and prepare meals for those in need. Thanks to their efforts, approximately 900 men, women, and children are provided with shelter throughout the cold winter months and approximately 3,000 meals are served to people in need during this period.

PADS has been part of the Elk Grove community for the last 30 years, with a site at the Christus Victor Lutheran Church. Unfortunately, the pandemic forced all PADS sites to close. Last year, only a few PADS sites reopened to continue providing this service to people in need.

Christus Victor is considering re-opening their site but requires assistance from volunteers willing to serve on the management team as Site Directors, Site Managers, Shift Coordinators, and Food Coordinators. These positions help ensure that operations run smoothly and efficiently so PADS can assist as many people as possible.

Members of the management volunteer team would be involved in behind the scenes planning and would be asked to help run the site one night a month. For full descriptions of these positions or other inquiries, please email <u>Ann.DeBartolo@CVLutheran.org</u>.


# **Plastic Bags - Do Not Place in Your Recycling Bin!**

Please keep plastic bags, newspaper bags, sandwich bags, case wrapping, and other plastic pouches out of your recycling bin!

Your recyclable items should be placed loose in the bin. Please do not bag your recyclables in plastic bags. Any plastic bags filled with items are assumed to be garbage — plastic bags filled with recyclables are not opened at the sorting facility and are assumed to be filled with trash for safety and efficiency purposes.

Additionally, plastic bags and other thin, soft plastic items get tangled in the sorting tumbler at recycling facilities. Employees then have to manually take the plastic out of machinery, which can be hazardous.

# Windy City ToolBank Grand Opening

This spring, Village officials joined the celebration for the grand opening of the Windy City ToolBank in Elk Grove Village! The Toolbank is a non-profit organization located at 2692 Coyle Avenue. Their location is well-stocked with tools and equipment that can help local community groups with tools needed for service projects, as well as tables and equipment needed to host events.



The Windy City ToolBank loans tools and supplies

for a fraction of the cost required to purchase them, and much less than it costs to rent. The borrowing fee is 3% of the value of the tools/equipment, which means \$1,000 worth of tools would cost only \$30 to borrow.

ToolBank staff showed Village officials around the supply area, and explained that their service model not only reduces rental costs for community organizations, it eliminates the need for storage and maintenance. #### You're Invited! Public Meeting for Tonne Road Improvements on August 16

The Village is hosting a Public Information Meeting for the Tonne Road Roadway Improvements project. The scope of work involves reconstruction of Tonne Road between Landmeier Road and Devon Avenue, and will include intersection improvements, accommodations for bicyclists and pedestrians. This public meeting will include a review of the need for improvement, presentation of the project, and a public input period. Similar to an open house, exhibits will be on display and Village representatives will be present to answer any questions and record comments.
