Village Awards \$750,000 Grant to Fund Expansion of EGHS Culinary Manufacturing Lab

The Village will provide Elk Grove High School with a \$750,000 grant to fund a major expansion of the school's Culinary Manufacturing Lab and create crosscurricular opportunities for students seeking career pathways in food production, restaurant and catering management. The grant will fund the complete modernization

of the school's Culinary Manufacturing Lab and make the program accessible to more students.

Elk Grove High School's Culinary Arts program is part of their Career and Technical Education Program. The goal of the expansion, according to school officials, is to combine the business and entrepreneurship

pathway with the culinary arts pathway to better acquaint students with all facets of operating a business in the food production industry. Specifically, the grant will provide needed funds to build a state-of-the-art industrial kitchen equipped with six gas ranges, as well as commercial-grade ovens, mixers, dishwashers, griddles and all the necessary equipment to operate a full-scale foodpreparation facility. The expansion will also include a classroom adjacent to the

> kitchen that will be used for instruction, serving, catering and hosting events.

> The Culinary Manufacturing Lab grant is just the latest initiative where the Village is supporting job training and workforce development through the school's Career and Technical Education Program. The Village recently provided the final installment of a five-year, \$500,000 grant to fund

the continued renovation of the school's advanced manufacturing lab in order to make manufacturing careers more accessible for young people.

Elk Grove Woods Plaza Development Update

The Village is excited to share that there have been significant advancements in the development process for the new gateway development at the southeast corner of Arlington Heights Road and Higgins Road!

Village officials have ironed out and approved the final design of the development. The Village has also assumed responsibility of constructing a pedestrian bridge over Arlington Heights Road to permit safer pedestrian and bicyclist crossings.

Elk Grove Woods Plaza Development Update

Last month, the Village Board approved an agreement with Wingspan Development Group for the redevelopment of the properties on the southeast corner of Arlington Heights Road and Higgins Road. This was the final approval needed from the Village to move forward with plans for the new mixed-use development and is the culmination of a process that began with a request for proposals from developers in the fall of 2022.

The Village shared the proposals with the community at an open house in November of 2022 and chose to move forward with Wingspan based on support in the community for their proposal. Following the open house, the Village worked closely with Wingspan Development Group to update the design for the development, incorporating community feedback from the open house and online comments to better match visual character of the community. In April of 2023, the Village held a second open house, inviting residents to view the updated design for the gateway development. Over 200 residents attended this Open House event and additional residents submitted feedback online. Feedback on the updated designs for the development was overwhelmingly positive.

Wingspan Development presented the final redevelopment plans, along with petitions to resubdivide the land into two lots—one for residential and one for commercial as part of a planned development—were presented to the Plan Commission at a public hearing in November of 2023. The Plan Commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of these petitions, which were then approved at the Village Board Meeting on December 12, 2023.

Construction of the new commercial space for the development is anticipated to begin in late 2024. Businesses located at the existing commercial shopping center will to remain open during the construction process. Visual renderings of the final design are included below and on the following page.

Pedestrian Bridge

Feedback from the November 9, 2022 Development Open House was overwhelmingly positive regarding the proposed pedestrian bridge over Arlington Heights Road. Due to the positive reception from residents, the Village decided to assume responsibility of the design and construction of a pedestrian bridge over Arlington Heights Road.

The pedestrian bridge, which was recently approved by the Forest Preserve District of Cook County will connect an improved sidepath on the east side of Arlington Heights Road to the Busse Woods trail on the other side. The bridge also features a lookout facing Busse Woods, two switchback ramps for ADA accessibility, and will be wide enough for twoway pedestrian and bicyclist traffic.

Does Your Tap Water Appear Cloudy?

This time of year, you may notice that your tap water appears to be cloudy or milky. This is typically associated with a decrease in outside temperatures. If you let the water stand for a moment, it will dissipate and clear up. The cloudy appearance is simply due to an increase in air in the water lines. If you listen, you can even hear the air bubbles breaking apart.

Calcium and mineral deposits can also cause the water to appear cloudy. It is a good practice to periodically check and clean the aerators, which are the small screens on most faucets. Mineral deposits can accumulate in faucets, causing excess particles in the water or reduced flow.

The More You Know With Public Works: The Truth About Flushable Wipes

Did you know that flushable wipes aren't so flushable after all! Unlike toilet paper, flushable wipes do not break down and constantly cause clogs that lead to sewer backups.

"Flushable" wipes get stuck in bends in the pipes, cling to grease buildup, and get stuck on tree roots. These wipes also clog the lift station pumps that are used to move wastewater out of the Village.

Sunday 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Anyone living in Suburban Cook County can vote early at Village Hall (901 Wellington Avenue) during the Early Voting period.

On Election Day (March 19, 2024), all voters must vote at their designated polling place. Please be aware that Village Hall is NOT a designated polling place on Election Day.

If you are not yet registered to vote, you can do so in advance online at <u>ova.elections.il.gov</u>. You can also register to vote in-person at Village Hall, or at your designated polling place on Election Day.
