
First, we wanted to thank our CERT members and others who volunteered to help run the Village's first Earth Day Recycling Event. With their help, the Village was able to recycle: 4,650 gallons of latex paint, 2,100 gallons of oilbased paint, 400 gallons of motor oil, 100 gallons of antifreeze, 500 CFL bulbs, and much more! Paint was by far the most popular item-- we collected 37 gallons of paint per minute! We understand that due to the popularity of the event some residents were not able to participate, and we look forward to setting up another event in the future to offer this unique new service to residents.

We have another recycling event coming up soon--June 4 is our annual Electronics Recycling & Document Destruction event, held at Fire Station 8 at 1000 Oakton. Details on this event can be found on page 3.

Document Destruction Guidelines

Residents are limited to six file-size boxes or paper shopping bags. Staples and paper clips are acceptable, but binders should be removed. Do not bring paper in plastic bags.

Who can Participate?

The event is open to Elk Grove residents and residents of other SWANCC communities. IDs will be checked for proof of residency. Materials from businesses, institutions or schools will not be accepted.



HELP KEEP OUR STORM WATER CLEAN!

Storm water runoff is rainwater that runs off rooftops, lawns, driveways and streets in our community. As it flows, it picks up dirt, leaves and grass clippings, pesticides and fertilizers, oil, litter and other harmful contaminants. All of these pollutants are carried by storm water through storm drains into our creeks and rivers and ultimately into Lake Michigan.

There are simple ways that residents and businesses can all help in reducing the amount of these pollutants that



enter our creeks and rivers:

- Don't dump used motor oil, antifreeze, or other hazardous materials on the ground or into sewers. Recycling programs are available for these hazardous materials and many service stations accept motor oil for recycling.
- When cleaning your driveway, dock, or parking lots, use a broom instead of water and dispose of debris in the trash; not in the street or storm sewer.
- Don't dump branches, leaves or grass clippings along creek beds, in open ditches, or in the street.
- Minimize the use of herbicides, pesticides and fertilizers. Native plants lessen the need for herbicides.
- Pick up litter to prevent it from getting washed into the storm sewers and eventually into our waterways.
- Cover piles of dirt and wood mulch fand sweep up debris--don't wash it into the street.

HOMEOWNERS BEWARE - EDUCATE AND PROTECT YOURSELF

One of the biggest responsibilities we face as homeowners is the maintenance and upkeep of our property and possessions. Significant financial expenditures come with such maintenance and often problems occur when you least expect or can afford them.

Unfortunately, unethical opportunists are out there looking to take advantage of those unfamiliar with the scope of work and how much money actually needs to be invested to resolve the issue.

The Village cannot protect homeowners from contractors who convince them to have unnecessary work done, or from contractors who charge an unreasonable amount of money for a particular type of work. However, we can offer some suggestions to help safeguard yourself.

If you have the need for maintenance work of any kind, be sure you make an informed decision when choosing a contractor:

- Talk to your friends and neighbors to see whom they may recommend, either to hire or to avoid.
- Get at least two or three quotes from different contractors.
- Call the Village (847-357-4220) to see if the contractor(s) you are considering have the appropriate business licenses and up to date credentials with the Village.
- Discuss the work to be done with your contractor and do not be afraid to ask questions.
- If something doesn't sound quite right or doesn't make sense, call the Department of Community Development at 847-357-4220. Our experienced building, engineering and health personnel will be happy to discuss your concerns.

Creedence Clearwater Revival founding members, Stu Cook and Doug "Cosmo" Clifford have been on quite a ride. Over 47 years ago, Creedence Clearwater Revival headlined at the Woodstock Music Festival. That year, 3 of their albums were top 10 on the rock music charts and the group had 4 top 3 singles. Following their induction into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame, Cosmo and Stu launched their Creedence Clearwater Revisited project in 1995, to again perform live in concert the touchstones of a generation.



RODNEY ATKINS - TUESDAY, JULY 18, 7:30 P.M.

Atkins' first album included the #4 hit "Honesty (Write Me a List)". The first two singles off his second album, "If You're Going Through Hell (Before the Devil Even Knows)" and "Watching You" were ranked as the top country songs of 2006 and 2007. The album produced two more #1 singles in "These Are My People" and "Cleaning This Gun (Come On In Boy)". It's America (2009) included the #1 single "It's America" and the top 5 hit "Farmer's Daughter". Take a Back Road (2011) produced his sixth #1 in its title track.



KOOL & THE GANG - TUESDAY, JULY 25, 7:30 P.M.

Kool & The Gang has sold over 70 million albums and influenced the music of three generations. Songs like "Celebration",

"Cherish', "Get Down On it", "Ladies Night", "Summer Madness", and "Fresh", earned them 2 Grammy Awards, 7 American Music Awards, 25 Top Ten R&B hits, 9 Top Ten Pop hits, and 31 gold and platinum albums. Kool & The Gang has performed for the past 45 years and their bulletproof funk and jazzy arrangements have made them the most sampled band of all time.

MAY IS MOTORCYCLE SAFETY MONTH

To see or not to see, that is the question. The roadways are clearing up, the sun is up longer, and the world is waking up from its winter hibernation. It is time to re-adjust our driving habits. Gone is the season of just seeing trucks and cars driving around the roadways of Elk Grove. Now we need to be aware and see the smaller two wheel varieties, motorcycles. The Harley, the Yamaha, the Suzuki, or the occasional Ural with a sidecar. Whatever the variety, we need to remind ourselves to remember to look for and see these vehicles.



Reminders for Drivers:

Please remember that motorcycles are a lot smaller than cars and can be difficult to see. Most are required to have a headlight on when the ignition is on. Some older models or custom models may not have this option.

A common occurrence in a motorcycle versus car crash is the car pulling out or turning in the path of the motorcycle. Often times the driver claims to have never seen the motorcycle. Before pulling out or turning take the time to look twice. Make sure to look for all types of vehicles on the roadway.

Reminders for Motorcycle Operators:

Remember your conspicuity! Conspicuity is the ability to be seen by others. Bright colors, retroreflective vests, modulating headlights, or just headlights. All of these help your ability to be seen by the rest of the motoring public.

Also, remember that the braking ability of a motorcycle is fundamentally different from the car you've been driving all winter. Many operators prefer to use the rear brake only. They falsely believe that using the front brake could increase the potential for flipping, and using just the rear brake is safer. When in fact the front brake is the primary brake of a motorcycle. Just think of what happens when you slow. Think how you weight shifts putting more weight on the front tire and less on the rear. If only the rear brake is used, the braking distance is drastically increased. To get the best braking out of a motorcycle remember to use proper combination braking using the front and rear brake.

DISTRACTED DRIVING AWARENESS

May is also Distracted Driver Awareness Month, and any discussion of distracted driving must include scourge of our modern roadways: The Smart Phone.

In the information age we are all connected, and many seem to think that it is necessary to stay connected via cell, text or social media, even while driving. It is easy to forget that taking your eyes off the road to answer a text risks your own safety, as well as the safety of your passengers, pedestrians, and others on the roadway.

Illinois has enacted many laws in attempts to minimize distracted driving. The Illinois Vehicle Code prohibits a person from driving while using a hand-held electronic communication device. The goal is to keep eyes on the road and the mind mentally aware of our surroundings so crashes are minimized as much as possible.

VILLAGE OPTS OUT OF COOK COUNTY SICK LEAVE & MINIMUM WAGE ORDINANCES

As you may know, Cook County recently approved legislation affecting the minimum wage and sick leave requirements for employers in the county. As the legislation was scheduled to go into effect July 1, 2017, the Village took advantage of the opportunity to carefully consider and explore all options before determining the decision that was right for our community.

To better understand the full perspective on this important topic, the Village took a number of steps. In February, Mayor Johnson hosted a televised roundtable discussion on the issue with local business owners as well as a representative from Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle's Office. Input was solicited from the Village's business community and we also held a public meeting to give the general public the opportunity to speak on the issue.

We would like to thank everyone who took the time and effort to contact us regarding these issues. We truly appreciated the opportunity to hear different perspectives on

the issue, and value the community input which helped educate us on this important business topic.

After considerable input from business owners and community members, as well as much research, and many deliberations, the Elk Grove Village Mayor and Board of Trustees reached a decision on both minimum wage and sick leave. The Village decided to utilize our Home Rule authority and "opt-out"



of both the Cook County Minimum Wage requirements as well as the Cook County Sick Leave requirements.

Businesses in Elk Grove will therefore follow the State Minimum Wage and moreover not have any mandated requirements for Sick Leave (unless otherwise adopted by some future State or Federal action). Our action is identical to the action of many other surrounding suburbs.

In addition, Elk Grove Village had discussed the adoption of our own minimum wage and sick leave requirements. This was due to the State of Illinois considering legislation that would have placed the Cook County requirements onto Elk Grove Village businesses. The good news is that the State appears to have dropped the proposed legislation. Therefore, Elk Grove Village was not compelled to develop its own minimum wage or sick leave requirements.

ELK GROVE VILLAGE INDUSTRIAL VACANCY RATE CONTINUES TO REACH RECORD LOWS

The Village's industrial vacancy continues to drop to unprecedented levels. Our first quarter industrial vacancy rate for 2017 stands at a mere 3.56%!

FRAUDULENT PURCHASE ORDER SCAM WARNING

The Elk Grove Village Police Department would like to remind its businesses to be wary of fraudulent purchase orders.

On a national level there has been an increase in the amount of fraudulent purchase orders leading to permanent loss. While these fraudulent orders are nothing new, they continue to evolve and are ever more complex and convincing. Often, these orders mirror an existing vendor and may even utilize a fictitious email address linked to that vendor. Once the order is received by the victim and



processed, the order is shipped to the requested location where it is received by a third-party and usually re-shipped overseas. In many cases these purchase orders state Net 30 Terms, (Net 30 Terms require full payment of the order within 30 days) and the victim only knows they have been scammed after the 30 days have passed with no payment received.

Whether a purchase order is given by email, phone, fax, etc. always verify its legitimacy by making unsolicited contact with known contact information, utilize vendor management software, and be vigilant. Get to know your customers and their purchase orders. If you notice any inaccuracies, duplicate PO numbers, changes to shipping locations, use of other third party shippers, or anything else that strikes your suspicion, verify the order before filling it.

If you identify a fraudulent purchase order or become a victim of one, it is imperative to call 911 immediately. D delaying the report lessens your chance of recovering the order and potentially places you and other businesses at continuouss risk of further scams.
