NEW ELK GROVE VILLAGE FIRE STATION RECEIVES NATIONAL ACCOLADES



The Elk Grove Village Fire Department and FGM Architects have earned national recognition for fire station design. Elk Grove Fire Station 8, which opened last spring, won the silver award in the category of "satellite stations" in the sixth annual Firehouse Magazine Station Design Awards.

According to Firehouse Magazine the award recognizes "outstanding architecture and design from fire departments nationwide."

The new Fire Station 8 at 700 Fargo Avenue is a 21,000 square foot facility with a 4-story, 11,000 square foot training tower located within the Elk Grove Village Business Park. A slightly smaller version of the same fire station design was built at 676 S. Meacham.

The two new fire stations were constructed to allow for enhanced operational efficiency and sufficient space for future growth. In addition to designing the station for operational needs, the Fire Department and architects also implemented proactive measures to ensure the safety of personnel to combat the incidence of cancer in firefighters due to exposure to carcinogens.

The new training tower at Fire Station 8 will provide Elk Grove Village firefighters with ample opportunity to hone their fire suppression and lifesaving skills and utilize new technology such as infrared imaging cameras to locate trapped victims in rooms filled with smoke.

"It is a genuine privilege to have our facilities recognized as being among the best in the nation. Credit to this award goes to FGM Architects and to our men and women, many of whom provided input to architects as the facility was being designed," said Fire Chief Richard Mikel. "We are better equipped to keep our community safe when we have top-notch facilities where we can train and operate from. We're grateful for the recognition, but more grateful that this Village places such a priority on public safety."

K-9 MACK RETIREMENT

On November 1, K-9 Mack retired from the Elk Grove Village Police Department after serving 3.5 years as one of Elk Grove's finest. In May of 2016, K-9 Mack was welcomed to the police department and partnered with Officer Rick Meyers. In Mack's first 6 months, he located approximately \$200,000 worth of drug money concealed in a vehicle. K-9 Mack also tracked and located many offenders who have tried to flee crime scenes.

During his time as an Elk Grove Village K-9, Mack participated in the International K-9 Olympics winning first place in an open area narcotics search competition and the narcotic exterior vehicles search. He also participated in many community events over the years as well as a 1.5 mile obstacle course similar to the "Tough Mudder" called the "Muddy Buddy".

His handler Officer Meyers stated, "I enjoyed working with him because our personalities matched very well together". Officer Meyers will be adopting K-9 Mack so he can enjoy his retirement with his best friend and family. One of K-9 Mack's favorite hobbies is to play with his giant red ball and he looks forward to doing a lot more of that in retirement. Prior to this project, the VFW Hall had no ground floor entry and the only point of entrance into the VFW Hall was by staircase. The installation of this elevator is the culmination of community efforts to support out veterans by making the VFW Hall, our Veteran's home away from home, truly accessible. for veterans and guests.

WATER METER REPLACEMENT COMING SOON!

The Village of Elk Grove will soon begin the process of installing new water meters in all residential, industrial and commercial buildings. The majority of the Village's existing water meters are beyond the American Water Works Association's recommended lifecycle of 20 years.



WATER METER REPLACEMENT TEAM

The Village has contracted with Siemens for this water meter replacement project. Water meters will be replaced between approximately February 2020 and June 2020. Residents will receive a notification postcard via mail from Siemens prior to meter installation. This notification will include a phone number to call and a website where residents can schedule an appointment to have their meter replaced.

Winter Snow and Ice Control

Public Works stands ready to respond to this winter's freeze in a timely and expeditious manner. Our equipment has been readied and salt supply has been secured. Residents and businesses play an important role in ensuring our streets are maintained in a clean and safe condition. We would like to thank everyone in advance for their cooperation, patience and understanding during the unpredictable winter season.



To help achieve a successful snow removal season please keep in mind these tips:

🔆 Parking Restrictions

When 2 or more inches of snow have fallen or are predicted to fall, do not park on any public street. Parked vehicles slow the progress of our snow removal fleet and often result in a section of roadway left unplowed. Parking is prohibited on both sides of a public street for 24 hours after the snowfall stops or until the clearing operation is complete.

🔆 Be Considerate of Pedestrians and Seniors

Residents and businesses are asked to shovel their sidewalks, clearing a path for pedestrians. In addition, please assist your neighbors who may be unable to clear their walks.

🔆 Plowed-In Driveway Aprons

Snow removal equipment is designed to push snow to the parkway and unfortunately, pushing snow onto driveway aprons is unavoidable. Property owners can minimize the amount of snow pushed onto driveways by placing snow on their side of the sidewalk, as well as placing driveway apron snow in the parkway away from the flow of traffic to help our plows to push snow away from your driveway rather than onto it.

🔆 Do Not Push Snow Into Streets

Driveways and sidewalks should be cleared by placing the snow on your property or adjacent parkway. Pushing snow into the street creates hazardous driving conditions and negates the effort of our snow operation. It is unlawful to move snow from driveways or private parking lots onto Village streets or the right-of-way.

🔆 Drive Cautiously

Whenever practical, please stay off the roads during a heavy snowfall. If you must travel, drive slowly and cautiously. Please yield to snow removal equipment.

Overnight Parking Restrictions waived for Holidays

From December 21 through January 5, residents and visitors can park on residential streets overnight. Please remember that residential street parking is prohibited if there is more than 2 inches of snow on the ground or if the Village is expecting snow.

SAFE SNOW REMOVAL TIPS

Take precautions when removing snow – snow blower and snow shoveling injuries are common this time of year. Snow blower injuries usually occur when someone places their hand in the machine while it is running. Snow blowers tend to get clogged with debris or wet snow. Even if the engine is off, when the clog is removed the torque propels the blades and serious injuries can occur.

Snow shoveling can also cause injuries. Below are some tips to remember when you go outside to begin shoveling.

- Shoveling is exercise, so treat it that way. Take a few minutes to stretch before, during and after shoveling snow.
- Bend your knees and use your legs as much as possible when lifting.
- Use a shovel with a bent handle to reduce forward bending and reduce stress on the back
- If the snow is light, push it rather than scoop it.
- Wear good footwear to help avoid slips and falls.
- Take frequent breaks to stretch and rest.
- If the snow is wet and heavy, tackle it in layers
- Start slowly and develop a steady pace
- Remember to always stay hydrated.

It is always important to dress in layers and cover your head with a hat, your neck with a scarf and your hands with warm gloves. Finally, it is always worth remembering neighbors on your block who might not be able to remove the snow from their sidewalks. A few minutes of help can make the world of difference as well as make you a good neighbor!

- Keep your pet on a leash: Pets must be secured on a leash no longer than 8 feet. Walking your pet on a leash protects your pet from traffic, unrestrained animals and provides a way for your pet to be properly introduced to people or children you may encounter.
- Maintain Supervision: It is neither safe nor appropriate to allow your dog to roam free. We ask pet owners to respect their neighbors and be cautious of their pets' whereabouts.



• Pick up after your pet: Be a responsible pet owner and do your part to clean up after your pet.
